From The Executive Director/President/CEO Mark Lucier:

Connections run deep throughout our organization and bind us to the students and families we serve. The connections to our greater community are the foundations of our organization's strength. They are the glue that creates a strong CTDS community of caring and dedicated staff who continue to do incredible, impactful work.

In my short six months as Executive Director, I witness on a daily basis the hope that is created on our campus. This is especially true for our newer students as they begin to develop relationships with staff and each other and gain trust that they are cared for and appreciated. This hope can be seen in the faces of our students as they come to campus every day, families as they come to meet with staff, and alumni as they return for visits. Finally, I am grateful for the opportunity to lead such a relevant and vibrant organization and am optimistic as we move forward into the next 50 years. I want to thank all of you for your generous support as we close out a successful 2023 and begin our 50th year with renewed energy and dedication.

Working together we can continue to make sure all our students reach their maximum potential and have the opportunity to have meaningful and productive lives.

Personally, the word "foundations" captures best the state of the school as I reflect back on 2023. CTDS emerged from the pandemic with a foundation of greater resilience, enhanced financial strength, and deepened commitment to our community. In particular, our students and alumni families embody this balance, and it is not easy for any institution to achieve.
